# The long-long O

For a pair that normally runs M45S and have been orienteering for fewer years than most W10's, the thought that we should enter, and then even run, a long O was perhaps a bit optimistic. Anyhow, during one of the many rain breaks in Norway, the conversation got round to the Dartmoor Long O in early October.

Realism struck and we eventually entered the medium course (only 17km and 500m of climb).

After a period of not so intensive training that would have involved plenty of long hill runs if Steve hadn't pulled a calf muscle and Nigel hadn't been so busy at work, we found ourselves in the primary school car park in Princetown unloading our supplies.

In addition to our normal O stuff we had energy gels, energy tablets, energy bars and energy drinks, non of which we actually used, (we just carried them round for a bit of extra weight training). What we did consume, when we remembered, were the jelly babies. The green ones in particular had a great flavour.

At the start line we were presented with two laminated, double sided, A3, 1:15,000 maps. Our initial, and as it turned out, our only problem, was how to use a thumb compass with a laminated map that refused to fold. (Answer; with difficulty)

The sun came out on the way to the first control and thereafter the time flew past as we jogged (well, walked up the steepest hills) our way round from control to control looking at the views and talking about really important issues such as why Swansea City were having such a good start to the season. (answers on a postcard to SBOC)

Just over two hours later we were both surprised to realise that we only had two controls to go and forty minutes later (long way between controls) we arrived at the finish, exhausted but well pleased with our efforts.

A really enjoyable three hours.

The best bits, the views and a meal and a couple of pints in a pub afterwards; the worst bit, the two kilometre run downhill to the finish and undoubtedly our muscles in a couple of days time.

A big thank you to the weather for being so kind (the last time I was on that part of Dartmoor was 30 years ago when I ended up walking from Two Bridges to Oakampton on a compass bearing due to absolutely zero visibility) and to Devon OC for such a well planned and executed event.

#### KIMM 2005 Eastern Lakes

Several SWOCies made the long journey (7+ hours )up to Pooley Bridge for this years KIMM. Due to various injuries I had teamed up at the last minute with Jill Manning for my first Short Score event.

The weekend weather forecast seemed to vary from very wet to sunny during the days before the event and changed depending which channel you were watching. We should have realized that the beautiful red sky on Saturday morning was an indication of things to come.

Due to our unplanned late arrival on Friday evening we left registration until Saturday morning. Race headquarters were at a caravan park with plenty of toilets and hot showers! Administration was fantastic at usual and we started uphill to the start just as the heavens opened. As Jill had done previous score events we had decided that we could probably cover about 16 Km in the 5 hours available and had a piece of string to use as a guide (unfortunately she dropped it on the way to the start resulting in a minor panic but it was found).

We were hoping that we would be able to plan out route to take in some of the more scenic parts of the area but one glance at the map made it obvious that we would have to be superwomen to get around the end of Haweswater in the allotted time. That left us with a virtual direct route to the campsite picking off as many controls as possible on the way. In the end we managed to get 200 points and were glad to have plenty of time to reach the finish which was uphill. The campsite was quite exposed and we should have opted to hide amongst the gorse bushes on the lower slopes rather than the wall in the higher field. The evening is quite long when you arrive at camp at 3pm and unfortunately the rain set in making socializing difficult. People were still coming off the hill by torchlight at 8pm.

It was a memorable night, one of our carbon fibre tent poles snapped in the gale at 12am and after a temporary repair with an aluminium tube and strapping snapped again an hour later! We packed our sacs ready to make a quick exit if required but by clever use of a crepe bandage and a tent peg managed to rig an internal guy which held until morning. I can't say we slept much though! The next day we had a 40 minute walk to the start and as we suspected there was very little route choice, basically back the way we came. We opted to brave the driving rain and gales and take the high route to High Street. We managed to collect 190 points coming 96th overall (4th Female). On both days we covered about 18Km which was further than expected. A very enjoyable weekend!! Next year the event will be called the OMM (Original Mountain Marathon) and will be held in Scotland -see you there!
