Saunders 2004

I didn't hesitate to agree to entering the Saunders when asked by a friend from the running club-then the doubts set in, she was in peak condition having just completed the Paris marathon and was more than 10 years younger!! Would my navigation-erratic at the best of times -be up to it?

The 2 day event is held in the Lake District on the first weekend in July with competitors carrying all they need for the overnight camp. As first timers we opted for the Harter Fell Course which had a total straight line milage of approx 30Km.

After completing several long training runs in blazing sunshine our thoughts turned to kit, we would never need those gloves and hats would we. Having completed several Polaris events I was definitely aiming for a light sac. Angies boyfriend was aghast when I produced bubble wrap for sleeping on and plastic cups!! In the event we only just crammed everything in with both of us carrying about 10lbs.

I had opted to take I;25,00 Harveys maps as we were only provided with a I;40,000 map and some latecomers had to manage with a black and white photocopy!!

Race Day Dawned and things didn't look too hopeful with gales and plenty of rain forecast. It was a miserable start. Full wetty's head to toe we walked the 10 minutes to the start and as we sat down in the pouring rain to mark off our check points trying desperately not to smudge the map we looked at each other and said "what are we doing here?" We decided to start and went up the first of many mountains The Old Man of Coniston. At the top visibility was almost zero and the wind was so fierce that we were blown off our feet but the worst was the pain and cold from the sleet which whipped across any uncovered skin. We couldn't even hear each other speak (this may have been a good thing!).

Our day didn,t get much better, on Swirl How a lens from my glasses blew away and it was half an hour before we could find anywhere sheltered enough to stop to find my spare ones. After 9 hours we reached the midway camp to find that of the 144 starters in our class only 49 had completed the course.

The next day—you guessed it, it was raining once again, but by the time we reached the first peak the sun was peeping through. We opted for the pretty route up Great Carrs via Swirl How to Wetherlam rather than taking the more direct route through the bracken which would have repeated the previous days route. The views were stunning "The second day was shorter but just as hard (especially as our legs were like jelly) the last check point seemed like the longest and the end seemed like it would never come but we made it and finished as 3rd female team. It was an amazing experience, the course was described to have crossed the highest and wildest part of the Lake District. It was meant to be a fell running weekend but we didn't do a lot of running on the first day as conditions didn't allow for it." We had such fun that we have both signed up for the KIMM with our partners . Surely the weather can be no worse in October???
