The Western Night League (WNL)

Night events are great fun and certainly make you concentrate! Details of the western night leagues can be found at www. westernnightleague.org.uk

They run from November till March usually on a Saturday night.

WNL events are a 1 Hour score format with penalties for lateness, starting at nightfall. Entry Fees £4 seniors, £1 juniors. For novices, approx 25% controls will form a yellow standard course. Best 6 of the events to count for the overall final rankings.

Western Night League New Changes 2006/7

In order to encourage participation, pairs will be eligible for the handicap competition. Scores from the last two seasons can be used to establish handicaps, where appropriate. Otherwise the first three events will be used to establish a WNL handicap.

The "Average Personal Handicap" (used for calculating scores) remains at 51.5%. This was the average handicap of active Orienteers in the 2005/6 season.

NEW -WNL Team Event

A Team Competition will be established in 2006/7, the details are:

The competition to take place over the last 5 events of the WNL calendar. Teams of 3 units (individuals or pairs) to be declared prior to the first eligible event.

To be eligible, all participants must have WNL handicaps, mixed club teams welcome.

At each event the aggregate handicap scores of the three team members will form the Team Score.

The best 3 events from 5 will be used to determine the winning team. The Team Event will run alongside the normal Individual competition and the Individual Handicap competition.

Thank you to Lauren and Nigel Ferrand who were organisers of the SWOC night event at Pontypool Park Disappointingly there were only 14 competitors but even the more popular venues have only been getting 25 entrants. The introduction of a new Team category is an attempt to increase participation.

with the map. A long walk back to the car and I realised that I would not be able to put out any more that day.

Saturday morning started bright and early with a telephone interview with Radio Wales at 6.10am (ouch!). Back to bed for an hour before loading the car with the kit for the day. Rendezvous with the controller at 10am at the bottom of the bridleway. The 3 trips each to put out most of the remaining stakes and flags were uneventful but very physical and my left shin was starting to hurt by the time we finished at about 4pm. 45 minutes to get home, shower and off to Brecon for the (very enjoyable) VHI meal. After picking up spare dibbers and SI units. I got home about 11pm and programmed up a clear station to ensure empty dibbers and got to bed by 11.30.

Sunday morning was another early start as I was meeting the controller at 6.45. Sensibly I took my car to the top of the bridleway as we had permission to park 2 vehicles there on the day of the event. There were 2 blocks of SI units to be put out each for the VHI (approx 36 in total) and we were on the area at 7.15. My first block went reasonably well apart from one control that had blown over in the night and lost its flag. A quick call to the controller as I had left my spare flags in the car. By the time I had got out to my 2nd block of controls my shin was really sore and I was hobbling. Halfway round I got a call from the controller. 'Do you know where the blank maps are for the start lanes?' Oh **** they are at home, having failed to put them in the pile of kit for the Sunday on Saturday evening. Finally got the last unit in place at 9.15, 15 minutes before the first VHI competitor started, but the work was not yet over. There was the small matter of 16 controls units (8 each) to put out for the Orange, Yellow and Light Green courses. I hobbled back and then round my share of the remaining controls only to find a missing flag from one of the more visible controls. This time I had a spare so replaced it. I got to the next control to find a further missing flag but with the lack of a 2nd spare assembled the unit without it. Finally all the controls were in place. Back to the car to pick up a blank flag for the Orange course control. A bit academic really as by the time I got back to put it out, a number of competitors had already been through the control.

I went back to the finish to allow Barbara Prosser a break before her replacement arrived. This gave me time to have a chinwag with people I knew and get some feedback from them on the courses (predominantly complimentary). Once reinforcements arrived at the finish I was keen that we got in as many controls as possible especially the most visible ones, as kids on motorbikes were going up and down the main track. Further hobbling and with the assistance of the controller plus Richard Dearden and Tessa Hill from HOC we got in 40 out of 68 controls on the day. Absolutely wrecked!!

Caroline Dallimore offered to collect some controls in the week. (This offer was very much appreciated as yours truly was struggling to walk from the train station to the office on the Monday morning.) Various emails ensued and Caroline ably assisted by Claire and Nick collected in all the remaining controls during the following week. The only thing to do was to go away, so disappeared to Prague the following Saturday for a 4 day break.

A lot of hard work, totally knackered, but the positive comments I received on the day and subsequently did make it worthwhile. Just don't ask to do it me again in too much of a hurry.

Newport to Merthyr Common – A planners tale.

Deep in the mists of time (December 2005 SWOC Committee Meeting) I agreed to plan the individual for the VHI plus a Welsh league event to run alongside, having not planned anything significant for quite some time.

Time moved on and by the middle of June an email arrived from Pete Colbert. The mapper had completed 95% of the map but due to a family bereavement could not finish the remainder straight away. A quick look confirmed sod's law, one of the two remaining pieces still to be mapped was the area earmarked to be used for the Orange and Yellow courses, but the part finished did look easier to read than the previous version. I decided to make my first visit to see how the map shaped up and was very pleased. Back home to do so more armchair planning whilst waiting for the final map. The map duly arrived by the end of July and planning began in earnest.

Two glorious sunny days in early September saw me taping control sites, sending draft courses to the controller Phil Jenkins and receiving plenty of constructive comments. Are the courses too long (the original M35/Brown was 11k) so yes they would have been, have we got the course ratios right according to the guidelines and so on. By the end of September the courses were very close to their final version.

The club had invited Phil Jenkins and Havard Prosser the organiser to the committee meeting on the 17th October to see whether everything was on schedule about a month before the event. That day I was not feeling 100% and realised that I would not be able to make the meeting. The following day I visited the doctor who diagnosed that I had Cellulitis above my right eye and would not be back in work in a hurry. I was off work for 8 days but towards the end of this period I was feeling a lot better and was able to do all the 'fiddly bits', cutting the lines and circles where features were obscured and adding the control descriptions to the artwork. This was completed and sent to the printers on Wednesday 1st November. The proof maps arrived two days later.

On inspection of the proofs I identified some minor corrections to the control descriptions. I agreed these with the controller and Emailed to revision back to the printer on the Saturday. I gave him a quick call on the Monday just to confirm that everything was OK only to find that the email with the final course numbers had arrived, but no sign of the one containing the revised course overprints. I left work early to send the Email again and get the revised maps to be sent back as PDF files before the printer left for the day at 6pm. The following day I gave the go ahead to print and arranged for the maps to be delivered to work.

The maps duly arrived Wednesday morning and I proceeded to start bagging that evening. I soon realised that the supposedly A3 map bags were not all A3, most being slightly too short. A call to Kate Balmond the club equipment officer, who said she had some more which would be OK. I arranged to meet halfway to collect the remaining map bags. I got them home only to find these were no better than the previous bags. A conversation with the controller ensued and we decided the best solution was to fold the top of the map to fit. At 1am I called it a day with about 80% of the maps bagged. At this point I was thinking that the quote from the printers to bag for 16p per map was a bargain. Only 45 minutes work was needed the next day to complete the bagging process.

I had booked Friday off work as contingency in case of bad weather on the Saturday and took the opportunity to start putting out controls. I started with the 10 most remote, putting out the SI unit, flag and stake. The first four were easy and then the mist rolled in. Navigation became more difficult and some relocation became necessary as I struggled to maintain contact
